NOTICE OF PROCEDURAL CONFERENCE

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a procedural conference will be held before Administrative Law Judge Julia Smead Bielawski on Friday, May 22, 2015 commencing at 10:00 a.m. at the Windsor Library Community House, located at 107 Main Street, Windsor, New York. A public statement hearing concerning these petitions will be held the evening before and is the subject of a separate notice issued on May 1, 2015.

As explained in more detail in the notice of public statement hearing, these proceedings concern petitions filed by Leatherstocking Gas Company, LLC (Leatherstocking) requesting that the New York State Public Service Commission certify franchise agreements pursuant to which Leatherstocking will provide gas service to the residents of the Town and Village of Windsor, New York.

The purpose of the procedural conference is to identify potential parties and provide all interested persons an opportunity to present and explain any proposals regarding the procedures to be followed in these proceedings, including

whether any issues of fact presented by the petitions or by the public comments warrant an evidentiary hearing. In the event that any interested party is unable to attend this procedural conference in Windsor, the party may contact Judge Bielawski to request participation by telephone conference.
