

HISTORIC WINDSOR ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

OCTOBER 3, 2013

The meeting began at 7:05pm with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The new local history pamphlet of the three river towns of Afton, Colesville and Windsor is available for limited distribution. The Town Clerk's Office has copies, as does the Village Office. Due to demand, there will be another printing next year.

The Indian Artifacts Collection on exhibit at this year's Window on the Arts Festival was very well attended. A special part of the history exhibit was a display of photographic images taken by me this summer of the Mohawk vessel found in South Winsor in 1928. This unusually large and quite rare pot has been in the collections of the Rochester Museum for the past 85 years. The display was available at the meeting.

The Susquehanna Archaeological Center in Waverly will present "Drum Beats Through Time" on Saturday, October 5th from 1 – 4pm. Exhibitors are requested.

Our expenses are now part of the Town budget. Copies of the estimated 2014 expenditures and revenues is available for review.

There is no change in the treasury.

There was a wonderful presentation by Oxford Historian, Vicky House. She presented her program "Covered Bridges and the Civil War" – a look at the importance of these bridges in the conflict between the North and the South. Accompanying her program were 25 storyboards on display and a power point presentation highlighting some of the most historical bridges. More than 20 people attended this meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 9:05pm.

 Notice of October 3, 2013 Meeting**

Greetings to all as we begin meeting again this fall on Thursday, October 3, at 7:00 PM in the Windsor Community House. Here is a look at the agenda:

- The new local history pamphlet of the three river towns of Afton, Colesville and Windsor is available for limited distribution at the meeting. The Town Clerk's Office has copies, as does the Village Office. Both Colesville and Afton have gone through them very quickly, so I know we will be doing another printing next year.
- The Indian Artifacts Collection Exhibit at this year's Window on the Arts Festival was very well attended. The displays of local artifacts were exceptional and filled the History Tent. A highlight of the day was Don Straub's flint-knapping demonstrations which drew quite a few people in. A special part of the history exhibit was a display of photographic images taken by me this summer of the Mohawk vessel found in South Windsor in 1928. This unusually large and quite rare pot has been in the collections of the Rochester Museum for the past 85 years. The photos show it in full size and detailed, and now we get to see its coloring and design. The display will be up at the meeting.
- I recently presented Town Supervisor Carolyn Price with an estimate on the Committee's revenues and expenditures for next year. Copies will be available at the meeting. We will be ordering archival boxes soon and have opened up a space in the History Room to set up shelving for the boxed items.
- We have a great program to start off our fall meetings. Oxford Historian Vicky House will be presenting "Covered Bridges and the Civil War"—a look at the importance of these bridges in the conflict between the North and the South. Her talk is accompanied by 25 storyboards on display and a power point presentation highlighting most of the bridges. She refers to them in letters read from New York soldiers.

Please let me know if you have anything to add to the agenda. I hope to see you at the meeting.
