§ 41-1. Permit required for burial in ground not cemetery.

No person shall cause a human cadaver to be buried, or establish a burial ground for such purpose, in the Town of Windsor, in any ground not registered as a cemetery with the New York State Department of State, Division of Cemeteries, on the date of enactment of this chapter without a Town of Windsor special burial permit.

§ 41-2. Time limitation for issuance.

A Town of Windsor special burial permit must be issued to applicants within fifteen (15) days of the filing of a completed application as described below; such permit may not be issued unless all of the below requirements are met.

§ 41-3. Contents of application.

Each application for a burial permit shall include the name of the person or persons seeking said permit; the purpose for which it is sought; proof of ownership by the applicant of the property sought to be used for such purposes; a certified copy of a letter from the Director of the Division of

Cemeteries of the New York State Department of State or his authorized representative, indicating that the agency has received and approved of the plans of said applicant and that the ground sought to be used has been registered as a cemetery by said agency; a certified copy of a letter from the Broome County Department of Health indicating that the applicant's proposed plans have been reviewed and approved by that agency; and a certified copy of a letter from the Chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals of the Town of Windsor, indicating that the use of the property as proposed by the applicant is consistent with the Zoning Law of the Town of Windsor. Each application must be signed by all applicants.

§ 41-4. When effective.

This chapter shall take effect immediately.
