President's Report

Elected Officials and Residents,

As we start our fifth year of service to the community, we would like to take a minute to reflect on this past year.

In 2022, our agency was dispatched 1,545 calls for service. This was a record number of calls for our agency. In 2021, our agency was dispatched to 1,311 calls for service. Prior to 2022, this had been our record number of calls for service. Our agency was able to respond to 1,368 of the calls. The remaining calls were covered by mutual aid agencies. This resulted in an 89.61 percent response rate for the year. We could not be more proud of the job our E.M.S. Providers did last year. These call statistics speak for themselves.

As you can see by our response statistics, Eastern Broome Emergency Services continues to be an agency that the Broome County Office of Emergency Services calls upon when the 9-1-1 system becomes overwhelmed with medical emergencies. Our agency is proud of the fact that we have proven our ability to routinely form off duty crews to cover additional calls for service making our agency a valuable asset county wide. If you review our call logs and the statistics in this report you can see the vast areas of the county which our agency has responded to over the past year.

Our Board of Directors and Management Team focused on updating equipment in 2022. Some of the equipment updated included new pediatric emergency bag systems. These bags are state of the art equipment and are provider friendly when it comes to treating any pediatric emergency. These bags contain twenty eight size-specific procedural modules in seven pouches. All seven pouches are color coded and sized separately for children 3 to 36 kg. There is also a Resuscitation/Infusion Guide, designed as a quick reference to common resuscitation IV push drugs. These quick guides help our providers avoid any medication mistakes while treating children in a life threatening emergency. All of the equipment in the bag is weight based so our providers can offer quick, emergency care to any child in need, potentially saving that child's life. The purchase of these bags was made possible by the Town of Windsor with special funding they made available to our agency. We also placed our second new ambulance into service in. This new ambulance was a 2022 Chevy Crestline Type III Ambulance. The cost of this new ambulance was mostly covered with grant funding from private foundations and

Broome County. We have one more new ambulance that is due to be delivered in the late Spring or Early Summer of 2023 which has also been funded through grants.

With the continued government financial support through the contracts, and the revenues from services provided, our agency remained financially sound throughout the year. We were able to exceed our operating plan most of the time offering additional hours of Basic and Advance Life Support Coverage to the communities we proudly serve while remaining on budget. Our agency also supported many local, not-for-profit community events this past year including the Deposit Chamber of Commerce Trout Run 5K, Deposit Chamber of Commerce Octoberfest, Deposit Lumberjack Festival and Windsor Town fair. We also participated in several community events throughout our district. These events included several parades, trunk-or-treat events and much, much more. Our agency and providers are proud to be part of this community and support community events.

In 2022, our agency began answering a call from our local hospitals who were in desperate need of help. Several of our local hospitals were in need of ambulances to handle inter-facility transfers for them. Our providers stepped up and answered the call. Our agency did several local interfacility transfers over the course of the year and a few to hospitals out of the area as far away as New York City and Philadelphia.

In the year ahead, Eastern Broome Emergency Services will remain dedicated to providing quality, compassionate care to the residents and visitors of the communities we serve. We will be focusing on our providers now that we have been able to upgrade the equipment they use on a daily basis. All of this great state of the art equipment is only good if you have trained, competent providers to use it. Our providers are our most valued assets. We hope that our Elected Officials and Residents are pleased with the essential services that our agency has been providing.

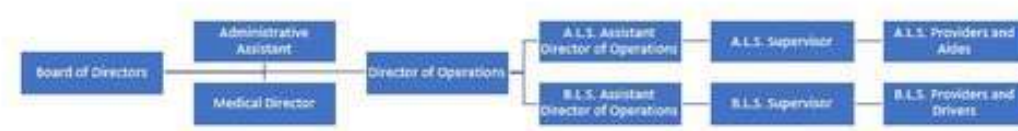

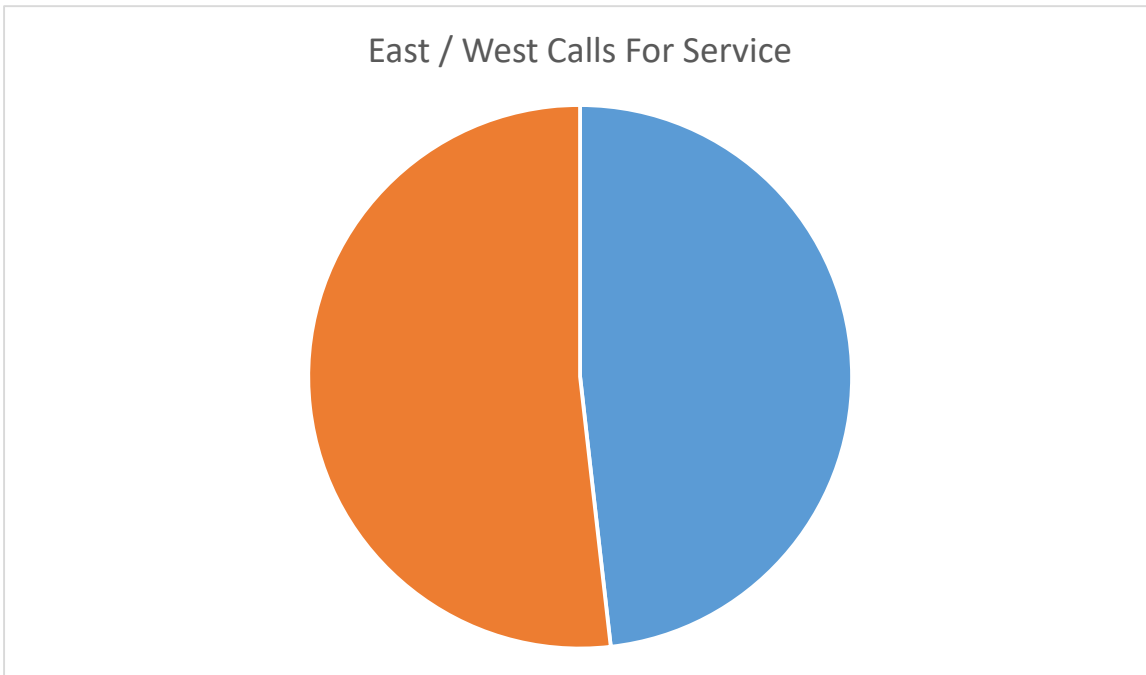

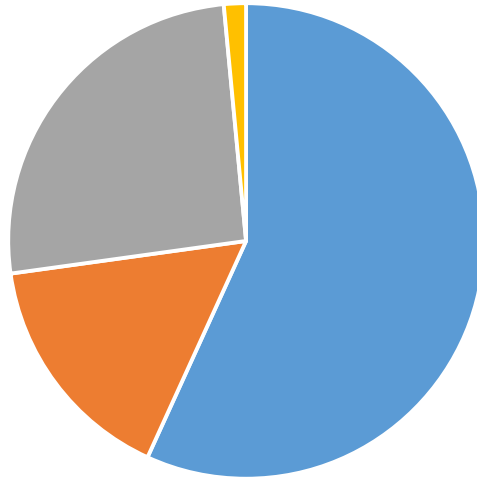


Blue: East District 530 48.2%

Orange: West District 569 51.8%

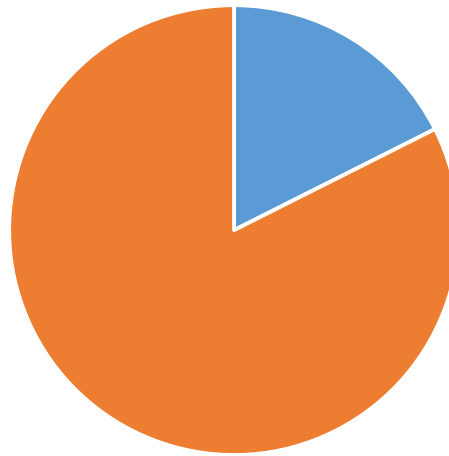

West District Call Volume

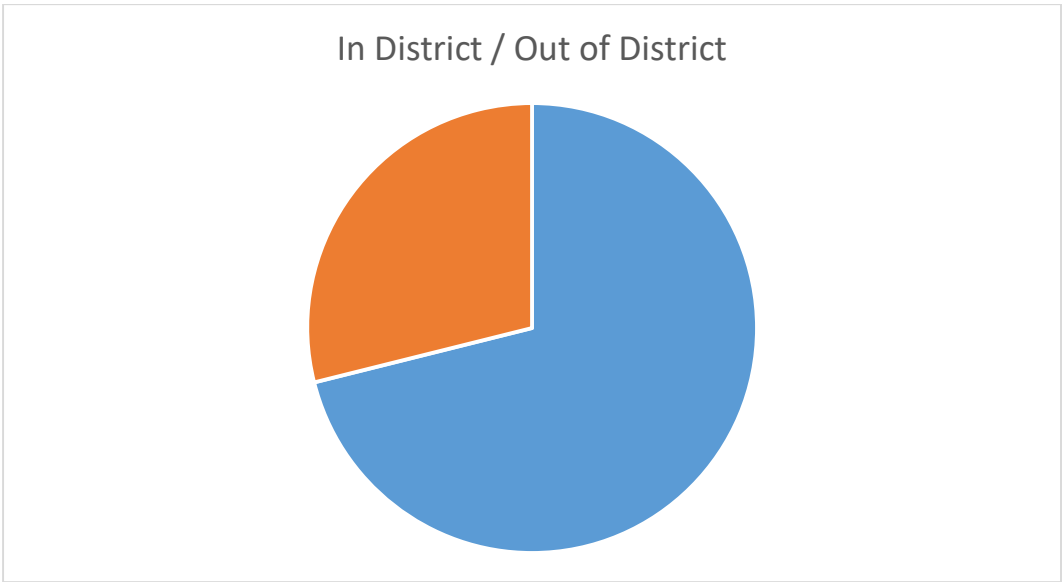
